

Residents are eligible for Rapid Rehousing if they meet the following criteria:

- Have an income less than 50% of area AMI.
- Do not have sufficient resources or support networks to avoid emergency.
- Lack a fixed or regular, adequate nighttime residence (e.g. living in a shelter, on the street, living in a place not meant for human habitation)

**OR** are fleeing/attempting to flee a Domestic Violence situation.

#### Eligible costs include:

- Rental Assistance: rental assistance moving forward.
- Financial Assistance: rental application fees, security and utility deposits, utility payments, and moving costs.

NOTE: This program CANNOT provide back payments for rent.

# **About Rapid Rehousing**

Rapid Rehousing provides
housing relocation and
stabilization services and/or
short– and/or medium-term rental
assistance to help individuals and
families experiencing
homelessness move as quickly as
possible into permanent housing
and achieve stability in that
housing.

This program is for individuals or families who may be: living in a shelter, living on the street, living in a place that is not meant for human habitation OR fleeing a Domestic Violence situation without supports.

Rapid Rehousing can pay securities and rent going forward in a new, permanent housing situation.

An Advocacy Program can help you through family court, criminal court, police departments and Child Protective Services.

A Counseling Program provides you with individual counseling and an educational support group.

A therapeutic support group is available for children who have witnessed domestic violence.

A Community Outreach Program provides community members with education, training, and information about domestic violence response and prevention
